Hello MCVO Members -

On behalf of the board and myself, I'd like to invite you to make a pitstop at MCVO.net to check out the new improvements and changes we've made to your club website! In 2023, we've updated the site theme, giving the site a modernized feel and look. This includes updating site security. We've also updated many pages to make browsing and finding information you need more fluid.



We've updated the <u>home page</u> with information to introduce ourselves to new potential members. We also updated the <u>Membership Information</u> page to make picking a VOA or MCVO membership much easier. The <u>Who's Attending</u> link in the Events area has also been updated to make finding your event even easier. Additionally, we have added some new tools to assist our board and event coordinators in collecting and distributing information easier.

Got a great picture of your car that you would like to see on the website? You can submit your favorite photo of your car to be displayed on our homepage by emailing it to president@MCVO.net! Photos will randomly change and be updated often.

One of the more exciting changes for myself was to move our online <u>Membership Directory</u> from a PDF to a database secured within the website itself. Just type your city name in the search area, and it'll show you exact matches. It also allows our Membership Director to update all records online and in real-time, displaying changes immediately.








BENCH RACING @ PMD Garage in Pontiac - March 1st

The Conner Avenue Assembly Plant, infamous for building the Dodge Viper prior to its demise in 2017, has recently been taken out of mothball status and converted into the Conner Center. The 77,000 sq. foot former assembly plant is now the home of the Stellantis (Chrysler) car collections. Consumer Energy Power Plant Tour - April 15th The Dan E. Karn Generating Station in Essexville

BIG ... like really BIG !!! That's the best way I can describe this electric-spewing beast we entered. I guess we can assume the 742,000,000 horsepower (equivalent of 524 Megawatts) output dwarfs our mighty Vipers.

On April 15th, the 22 brave MCVO members and guests marched forth into the beast. Station Manager, Sean Kelly gave us a warm welcome and an excellent presentation. He was peppered with many interesting questions, many about the technical operations and the marketing – related to the "grid" (called MISO) - where the generating station sells its output. All were revelations to us and all quite forthright and clear.

Upon entering the facility, we had another surprise. The power plant seemed so clean; at least when you consider that coal is involved in its operations! But cleanliness means safety and safety means the best operation for an industry that must be completely reliable to its consumers.

One of our group made an interesting observation, "all of the electricity comes from two generators." Yes, those generators were big (see the pics), but compared to all the other systems (air handling, coal movement, water boilers, steam lines, exhaust, cooling, etc.) needed to keep the generators humming - they seem kind of small. We were all a bit flabbergasted by the complexity of the process of making electrons. Not so much the simple diagrams we might have seen in school ... you remember, fuel into heat into steam into electricity. Editor's note: Bob might lose you in the next paragraph with techno-talk ...

Nope – the process to get the fuel (the coal) ready to burn is very complex. It is turned into a fine powder (coal dust) via three stages of big, noisy pulverizers. The coal dust is blown into a hot stream of combustion air and the dust is ignited in the boilers which then turn water to steam, at 1,000-degrees F and 2,400 psi. Whoa – then the steam pushes the turbines at exactly 3,600 rpm which yields 267 megawatts of power from each generator into the grid. Next stop – our air conditioners, TVs, electric blankets, microwaves, and now ... vehicle chargers, etc.

The whole process is orchestrated from one control room full of monitors and control panels, with one key operator in the center of a circular cluster of monitors, plus two additional employees keeping tabs on different monitors and read-outs surrounding half the room. The process isn't as simple as those diagrams anymore!

Parts of the Karn stations are on the way to being decommissioned later this summer, and Karn 1 and 2 were shut down while we were there. The station will only be used for peak demand, and then only as long as the coal on hand lasts. Consumers Energy is heading to "greener" sources; primarily wind power at this point. With parts of the station shut down, our tour guides were able to get us closer to the process, and we could hear much better. Many thanks to Sean and Tashia Walraven for taking the time to share their expertise with our group. It was an enjoyable learning experience.

Following the tour, we made our way to the Riverfront Grille at the downtown Bay City DoubleTree hotel. Delicious food, fantastic friends, plus the bonus of a Great Lakes freighter gliding up the Saginaw River and right past our windows. Dare I say a perfect ending to a perfect day? Yes, it was.



Tour at the Dan E. Karn Generating Station in Essexville
