VOA UPDATE

The Viper Owners Association (VOA) is our National club affiliation. As some of you are aware, the VOA required a loan two years ago to pay off some previous national club debts.



There was a lot of speculation and accusations as to what happened. The handling of the finances was not regulated within the By-Laws and without pointing fingers, spending was out of control.

As we have noted before, the VOA Executive Committee recently created three individual committees (Finance, Operations and Membership) to assist with getting the ship "turned around". The Regional Presidents and many other regional members are working diligently with the VOA to find ways to ensure a strong future. These committees have worked hard to review and cut expenses, plus have created changes to the National By-Laws which will regulate future spending. As of this writing, it appears the VOA loan will be paid off within 2 years! This is very exciting news!

MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

As of September 30th, MCVO currently stands at 192 members. Last year, at this time we were at 197 members. This drop could be due to several members retiring / moving out of our area; a few who have taken new jobs and moved out of state; or several members taking advantage of the robust Viper market prices and selling their cars.



Nevertheless, 192 members is still the second highest membership we have had since being affiliated with VOA. We have a good combination of Standard, Mamba, Affiliate and Associate membership levels within MCVO. But with that being said – it does not matter what level of membership someone has within MCVO – we are all here to have a great time with friends and their Vipers!!





cars were daily drivers but a few of us braved it! Still, the food was exceptional and the company just as good! Always a fun time! We look forward to this event every year.



















MOPARS at the RED BARN @ the Gilmore Museum - July 22nd





In Memoriam - Francois Castaing. July 27, 2023

Francois Castaing, one of the four founding fathers of the Dodge Viper passed away on July 27th. Many of the original Team Viper members were honored to have worked with him on the creation of the Viper and it has been noted (by Mark Vaughn in Autoweek) that Francois Castaing's involvement with Jeep was a major reason for the rise of the SUV market in American markets. His automotive career spanned over 30 years with Renault, American Motors, and Chrysler. Thanks for the VIPER!









Saddened to learn that Francois Castaing passed away today at the age of 78. He, along with Bob Lutz (Chrysler President), Tom Gale (VP of Design), and Carroll Shelby (Performance Consultant to Chrysler) are considered to be the "four-fathers" of the Viper. Francois was VP of engineering at the time and did a lot behind the scenes to bring the car to life.

I'm honored that he gave us exclusive rights to publish his story about the engineering of the Viper in Viper Quarterly last year. I think we all knew the end was coming, so we wanted to get his story in print while he could still edit/approve/see it.

Tony's contagious smile and wonderful personality will be missed by everyone. RIP, Mr. Venzano ... as many of us fondly called you over the years.












