In the Fall of 2019, I had the chance to meet Francie Krawcke of the Michigan Avian Experience at Hawkfest held in Lake Erie Metropark. After her presentation with her beautiful Birds of Prey, I asked about creating a unique opportunity for the MCVO members and their families to take a road trip. Francie agreed, so we set the date for June 27th. They love visitors as they are educators as well.

I think everyone was anxious to get out and do something in their cars as the Covid-19 crisis was taking its toll. A road trip was long overdue by the end of June. Practically all of our events had been cancelled, but since this was going to be outdoors, we had a great turnout. So, on a gloomy Saturday morning, led by our Motorsports Director, Mike Sutton, 11 Vipers and 7 or 8 daily drivers set out to Brooklyn, Michigan to visit this 501C non-profit Raptor Rehabilitation and Rescue. It was a beautiful ride, partially through the Irish Hills. Once we got there, however, the sun came out!







Francie's home and aviaries look like just another quiet country residence and she had a nice solid lawn for Viper parking. We were all free to wander the property. Sean and Laura Gavin's darling little girl, Madeline, had the best time hunting for critters; she found a pair of toads and a Praying Mantis. Francie took us around to introduce everyone to the birds while telling their stories on how they came to be in her care.



















We met an American Kestral, Turkey Vulture, Golden Eagle, Bald Eagle, Great Horned Owl (my personal favorite), Red Tailed Hawk and a Broad-Winged Hawk. All of these raptors are permanently injured and can't be released back into the wild. They NEVER keep a bird if it can be released. Francie also flies the Bald Eagle over Eastern Michigan University football games as the National Anthem is played. Even birds that can still fly, may not be able to survive in the wild due to their unique situation.

After seeing the birds, we all gathered and the Bald Eagle was brought out for individual photos. Sarah, another volunteer, was so sweet as she would duck down behind each person while holding up the Eagle so she wasn't in the photos. Occasionally you may see a random arm sticking out with an Eagle on it!.













After a full program, it was lunch time and many members wanted to stop to eat together "like before". Restaurants had just been allowed to reopen but were limited to groups of 10 or less. To compound this, none would hold tables for us. At that point most of the members had left, which left a small group of us. We went to the Beach Bar & Grille in Clark Lake at Francie and Sarah's recommendation. It turned out to be a great place for lunch and was our first time dining out since March. We did get caught in the rain on the way home but it was so worth it for the great day we had with our Viper family.

Francie and Sarah couldn't have been more accommodating to our group, and are genuinely two of the nicest ladies you'll ever meet. 

Hidden Gems of Pontiac

Our "Gems of Pontiac" day started at the private, never-open-to-the-public, collection of Larry Smith, founder and former owner of Autometric Collision. Although Larry's collection is split between here and Scottsdale, we were able to see what a real collector, driving enthusiast, automotive historian, skilled mechanic, body man, and painter, can accomplish. Larry's cars were, in his words, simply "Cars that I like!" He showed us his 1935 Hoffman, with a water-cooled X-8 engine. There is only 1 made, and little is known about it. Then his 1937 Graham, which was from new sent to Switzerland to the coachworks of Worbluffen. Again, another 1 of 1, with the original supercharger intact. Looking for some speed (aren't we always?) then some Corvette's, Porsche's, and Shelby's were in ample supply! And then the spectacular 1936 Stout Scarab, shown last year (and winning) at the Monaco Concours d'Elegance. There were 5 made, and they sold for 5 times the cost of a Cadillac. With doors of cast magnesium, and a shape like nothing else, it was just another example of rarity, Art Deco design, and technology that is found through Larry's extraordinary cars. His interest remains varied, as he told us that his first car to collect was a Triumph TR3 (also in the collection).























We then took a short drive to the PMD Garage, where Gordon Heidacker, a former Chrysler executive with ties to Team Viper, told us about their Viper capabilities! They had 50 Viper engine blocks inside, and are in the process of acquiring all of the existing Viper parts stock from Chrysler, for a full-service one stop shop for all Viper owners, for both stock originality and performance engine build!

Our last stop was at LBI Limited, a national sales organization of fine collector and sports cars, and where else could one go to find 4 Vipers for sale...but not average ones, low mileage, a GTS, and at the top of the heap, the Team Oreca Viper that won the 24 Hours of Le Mans! Don't we hope that one stays in the Detroit area! A fun day for MCVO members!


Event of Interest (EOI)




Battery Jump Starter


